Valera in Trujillo: In June and July, Marianela, a missionary from *Jesus is the Life Bible Church in Valera* led Bible studies with 18 children in two neighborhoods. Fall Fundraising >>>

During the CrossLink “Stay at Home” Fall Fundraiser planned for September 1 – November 30, 2022, we are hoping to raise funds for our biggest one-time and on-going financial needs in our ministry.

ONE-TIME NEED: Our biggest one-time financial need is \$12,000 for the immigration processing and legal fees for Pastor Misael’s permanent residency application which includes his family.

ON-GOING NEEDS: Our biggest on-going needs are the Hernandez Missionary Support Fund and the Venezuela Ministries Assistance Fund.

- Misael Hernandez is a CrossLink missionary pastor at New Life Bible Church in Yakima and plans to assist with the pastoral needs at Sinai Bible Church in Tieton after Pastor Juan Aguilar retires. CrossLink hopes to connect Misael with supporters who will pray for the ministry in Yakima and financially support Hispanic church planting and outreach efforts in the Yakima Valley.
- Venezuela Ministries Assistance Fund is a critical food outreach ministry for 31 churches in the Trujillo state of Venezuela.

Missionary Pastor Misael Hernandez Update >>>

Misael Hernandez, CrossLink Missionary Pastor at New Life Bible Church in Yakima, finished his sabbatical on July 29, 2022 after his religious work visa renewal was finally approved. We are grateful this part of the immigration process is over and Pastor Misael can return to the work that God has called him to do. Misael’s lawful permanent residency application was already approved and we expect his work permit to arrive within the next 12 months and his Greencard to arrive within the next 2 years. We will continue to wait for the Lord because we know that God is always at work, always good, and always present here with us.

While Misael could not legally work, CrossLink thanks the many volunteer pastors and church leaders who filled the pulpit, including CrossLink Board members; New Life’s Family Director, Hevel Dominguez; New Life Elders, and Pastor Pedro Espinoza from a sister church in Oregon.

Ministry continues to flourish at New Life Bible Church. During New Life’s summer kick-off, there were 36 youth that attended the evening programs and BBQ. The July Summer Family camp that connects New Life Bible Church with other bilingual churches in Washington and Oregon grew to 162 people.

During the time that Pastor Misael was limited by the delayed religious work visa to normal membership at New Life, he has been able to help a friend lay flooring at a Hispanic church in Grandview and connect with other volunteers who are attending Rio Grande Bible School.
